

**SUPPORTING STATEMENT

1. CIRCUMSTANCES NECESSITATING COLLECTION OF INFORMATION

IRS section 6044 requires payers of \$10 or more of patronage dividends to file an information return. Regulations section 1.6044-2 states that the return to be used is Form 1099.
