Abstract: This information is used to verify sightings of actual violations of the Act to Prevent Pollution from Ships (APPS) to determine the level of compliance with International Convention for Prevention of Pollution from Ships (MARPOL 73/78) and as a means of reinforcing the discharge provisions.

Burden Estimate: The estimated burden has decreased from 29,048 hours to 26,993 hours a year.

2. Title: Request for Designation and Exemption of Oceanographic Research Vessels.

Type of Request: Extension of a currently approved collection.

Affected Public: Owners or operators of vessels.

Abstract: This information is necessary to ensure a vessel qualifies for the designation.

Type of Request: Extension of a currently approved collection.

Affected Public: Shipyards, designers, and manufacturers of certain vessels.

Forms: None.

Abstract: This information collection requires the shipyard, designer or manufacturer for the construction of a vessel to submit plans, technical information and operating manuals to the Coast Guard.

Burden Estimate: The estimated burden has increased from 8,835 hours to 13,790 hours a year.

4. Title: Declaration of Inspection Before Transfer of Liquid Cargo in Bulk.

OMB Control Number: 1625-0039.

Type of Request: Extension of a currently approved collection.

Affected Public: Persons-in-charge of transfers.

Forms: None.

Abstract: A Declaration of Inspection (DOI) documents the transfer of oil and hazardous materials, to help prevent spills and damage to a facility or vessel.

Persons-in-charge of the transfer operations must review and certify compliance with procedures specified by the terms of the DOI.

Burden Estimate: The estimated burden has increased from 66,223 hours to 68,534 hours a year.
