As you may already know, rapid growth occurring in Las Vegas and North Las Vegas is creating increased demand for land where additional residential and commercial development can occur. As a result, some public lands surrounding the Upper Las Vegas Wash that currently are managed by the Bureau of Land Management are now being considered for possible auction to private investors and developers.

In making decisions about this situation, the BLM must consider the ecological condition and value of this land area, as well as the ways in which various development options could affect social and economic conditions for local residents and the broader community.

This survey is designed to help us, and BLM decision-makers, understand how social and economic conditions in nearby neighborhoods are linked to the landscape and environment that surrounds the Upper Las Vegas Wash.
