- Item 2a. Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) Category. The grouping of establishments by type of economic activity in which they are engaged.
- Item 2b. Products/Services. What the establishment provides according to the SIC Category.
- Item 3. Sponsor's Occupational Title. Specific title of an occupation that may or may not be the same as that designated by O'NET.
- Item 4. School-To-Apprenticeship (STA) Agreement. Formal arrangement between the sponsor and a secondary school for registering youth between the ages of 16-17 in an apprenticeship program.
