- Year when child started living at present address
- Christmas and other holidays (current year)

I’d like you to tell me when some important events have happened in the past year to [CHILD] or your family. The reason I’ll be asking about when these things happened is to help you remember things that happened in the last month and last year.

During the next part of the interview, you can answer most questions by saying "yes" or "no." If you're not sure about an answer, take some time to think about it. Only say "don't know" if you really have no idea at all. If I ask you a question you don't understand, just tell me.

If you want to tell me more than "yes" or "no" about something, let me know and I'll write it down so we can talk about it later.

I ask everyone the same kinds of questions. Just because I ask whether your child has done something, that doesn't mean I think [he/she] has.

Please answer each question the best you can. The best answer is a true answer.

INTRO 5

Okay, let's go over these things again – to make sure that I explained everything clearly. I'm mainly going to ask you to answer with "yes" or "no." What should you do if you want to tell me more than that about something?

**i: IF RESPONDENT DOESN'T KNOW OR IS UNSURE, SAY:
"Tell me so that I can write it down and we can talk about it later."**

What should you do if you aren't sure about whether to answer "yes" or "no"?

**j: IF RESPONDENT DOESN'T KNOW OR IS UNSURE, SAY:
"Well, if you need time to remember something, just say so and I'll wait. Or, if you don't understand a question, just tell me."**

INTRO 6

It's important that you notice that not all the questions are about the same time period. Most of the questions about the past year. When I say "in the past year," I want you to think about all of the time from [MONTH] a year ago (when [EVENT ON TIMELINE FOR ONE YEAR AGO]) right up until today (DRAW HORIZONTAL LINE ACROSS SPAN OF "LAST YEAR" ON TIMELINE).

A few questions will be about the past six months. When I say "in the past six months," I want you to think about all of the time from [MONTH] six months ago (when [EVENT ON TIMELINE FOR SIX MONTHS AGO]) right up until today (DRAW HORIZONTAL LINE ACROSS SPAN OF "LAST SIX MONTHS" ON TIMELINE).

Some questions will be about the past four weeks. When I say "in the past four weeks," I want you to think about the time from [the [BEGINNING/MIDDLE/END] OF MONTH] four weeks ago (when [EVENT ON TIMELINE FOR FOUR WEEKS AGO]) up to and including today (DRAW PARALLEL HORIZONTAL LINE ACROSS SPAN OF "LAST FOUR WEEKS" ON TIMELINE).

INTRO 7
