

**ATTACHMENT I**  
**Questions for Vacant Units**

In the American Community Survey, we collect information for units that are identified as vacant. We ask a knowledgeable respondent for answers to some of the housing questions from the ACS CATI/CAPI/TQA instrument, along with a few additional questions.

For vacant units, we ask VACUNIT\_CP:

<b>Is this unit...?</b>
<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. <b>For rent</b></li><li>2. <b>Rented, not occupied</b></li><li>3. <b>For sale only</b></li><li>4. <b>Sold, not occupied</b></li><li>5. <b>For seasonal, recreational or occasional use</b></li><li>6. <b>For migrant workers</b></li><li>7. <b>Other vacant</b></li></ol>

We also collect vacancy information for units occupied only by persons who do not meet our two-month residency rule. For these units we ask TEMPSTAT:

<p><b>Since no one is staying here for more than two months, I will not ask any further questions about the people staying at this unit. However, I will need to ask some basic questions about this housing unit.</b></p> <p><b>Is this unit...?</b></p>

We also collect the name, title, address, and telephone number of the person who provided the information about the vacant unit:
