Example Test Item

↑ Example 1

For Ages 2:6 Through 6:11

Say, I'm going to show you some pictures and ask you some questions. Each time you answer, say only one thing. Let's try it. Begin by administering Examples 1 and 2.

Example 1

Point to the picture of the cat, and say, What do you see?

Teach:

If the examinee responds correctly with cat, kitten, or kitty, reinforce the correct response by saying, That's right—cat. This is a cat. (Substitute the actual correct response.)

If the examinee responds incorrectly or does not respond, teach the correct response by saying, Cat. This is a cat.

If the examinee responds by saying, kitty cat or any similar multiple-word response that contains the correct response, teach by saying, Yes, but you must say only one thing. Cat. This is a cat.

Continue with Example 2.

For Ages 2:6 Through 6:11

Example 2

Point to the picture of the girl singing, and say, What is she doing?

Teach:

If the examinee responds correctly (e.g., singing, speaking, talking), reinforce the correct response by saying, That's right—singing. The girl is singing. (Substitute the actual correct response.)

If the examinee responds incorrectly or does not respond, teach the correct response by saying, Singing. The girl is singing.

Continue by saying, Let's do some more. I will show you a picture and ask you something. Remember, each time you answer, you can say only one thing. Listen carefully.

Begin testing with the age-appropriate Start Item.

However, if an examinee aged 4 through 6 responds incorrectly to one or both examples, start with Item 1.

Start Items by Age	
Age	Start Item
2:6-3:11	1
4	21
5-6	31

For Ages 7 Through Adult

Say, I'm going to show you a picture and ask a question. Tell me one word that answers my question and goes with the picture. Your answer must be only one word. Let's try it. Begin by administering Examples 2 and 3.

Example 2

Point to the picture of the girl singing, and say, What is she doing?

Teach:

If the examinee responds correctly (e.g., singing, speaking, talking), reinforce the correct response by saying, That's right—singing. The girl is singing. (Substitute the actual correct response.)

If the examinee responds incorrectly or does not respond, teach the correct response by saying, Singing. The girl is singing.

Continue with Example 3.
