SUBJECT: Authority to Conduct and Support Research Training Under the Graduate Partnerships Program

Pursuant to my previous letter of August 24, 1999, delegating to you the authority to conduct and support research training for which fellowship support is not provided under Section 487 of the PHS Act, and which does not consist of residency training of physicians or other health professionals, I hereby amend that delegation to allow additional redelegation for establishment of the NIH Graduate Partnerships Program.

This authority may be redelegated to the Director, Graduate Partnerships Program, but the redelegation must be in writing. This authority must be exercised in accordance with any conditions or restrictions imposed by law, regulation and/or written policy, i.e., 42 CFR Part 63.

A copy of the redelegation must be retained by you and by the incumbent of the position to whom the redelegation is made. A copy must also be provided to the Human Resource Policy Group, Office of the Director Executive Office.

SUBJECT:	Authority to Conduct and Support Research Training Under the Graduate Partnerships Program

Based on the authority delegated by the Director of the National Institutes of Health (NIH) dated December 18, 2001 I hereby delegate to you the authority to conduct and support research training for which fellowship support is not provided under Section 487 of the PHS Act, and which does not consist of residency training of physicians or other health professionals, for the purpose of establishing and conducting the NIH Graduate Partnerships Program. This authority is granted for support of students in training for a graduate degree.

This authority may not be redelegated. This authority must be exercised in accordance with any conditions or restrictions imposed by law, regulation and/or written policy, i.e. 42 CFR Part 63. A report should be submitted quarterly on the progress of the Graduate Partnerships Program.

A copy of the redelegation must be retained. A copy must also be provided to the Human Resource Policy Group, Office of the Director Executive Office.
