1. Introductory letter to respondents

The Science and Technology Policy Institute (STPI), a federally funded research and development center based in Washington DC, has been directed by the National Institutes of Health (NIH) to evaluate the process by which recipients of the NIH Director's Pioneer Awards (NDPA) were chosen.
