- 4. **Objectives:** You are natural problem solvers. You have naturally analyzed information, weighed the choices, and have made decisions that make sense to you. I need you to help me understand those things that surround the decisions you've made.

I. <u>Warm-up</u>

- 1. What is your name?
- 2. Where do you live & who lives at home with you?
- 3. What do you do with most of your time? What do you do for a living?

II. Tax Prep and Filing Exploratory

- 1. Now we are going to discuss tax preparation and filing. How do you typically file your taxes?
 - a. When it comes time to prepare and file your federal taxes, where do you start? Where is the first place you go/look for information?
 - b. If it is the internet, what site do you visit first? Any others?
 - c. Who do you trust to give you the best information regarding preparation and filing of your federal taxes? What agencies, organizations, or companies do you trust?
- 2. Would you consider going to the IRS website to evaluate tax preparation options? What makes you say that?

 - a. How do you feel about that overall idea? Is that relevant to you? Interesting?
 - b. Knowing what you know already about Free File, does this seem to be a good representation of the program? What is missing?
- 3. New News Does this impact how you think or feel about using Free File?
 - a. Does this add anything to what you already think or feel about Free File? See it in a new light?
 - b. If you heard or saw this idea, would you be interested in finding our more about the program?

(REPEAT FOR EACH EXECUTION APPROACH)

- 4. Which of the messages about Free File is the most relevant to you and how you think about preparing your federal taxes?
 - a. What specifically about that message makes it relevant to you? What stands out to you the most?
 - b. How would you describe this message to someone who has never seen it? What is the most important things for them to know?
 - c. Do you find any of messages problematic in any way? What specifically makes you say that?

(EXISTING MARKETING)

There have been a number of different marketing messages in the market place. I'd like to see if you had seen them and what you think about them over all. (SHOW OLDER IRS AND "COMPETITIVE" ADS)

- 5. What were your thoughts and feelings about this marketing?
 - a. What does this ad say to you about Free File? What does it tell you about Free File? Who was this ad for? Who created this ad?
 - b. Knowing what you know already about Free File, does this seem to be a good representation of the program? How does this compare to what the IRS was referencing in its advertising?

- c. If you heard or saw this idea, would you be interested in finding our more about the program?
- d. How do these older ads compare to the ideas from the IRS we talked about earlier?
- e. Thinking about everything you have seen today, which of these messages about Free File is the most relevant to you and how you think about preparing your federal taxes?
- f. Do you find any of messages problematic in any way? What specifically makes you say that?
- 6. We have been talking about this Free File program for some time now. So is there a way of talking about it that you think is important but is missing here?
 - a. Based on what you know about Free File now, what is the biggest reason why you would NOT use Free File for preparing and submitting your Federal Income Tax Return?
 - b. What would have to change or be different for you to consider using Free File?

VI. <u>CONCLUSION</u>

- 1. Beyond just what we have been talking about here, what would make it easier for you to file your taxes?
 - a. People say all the time, "I'm doing my taxes this weekend" or "I did my taxes last night". What does that phrase, "do your taxes" mean to you?
 - b. What are all the different activities that are included in that idea? Does that mean prepare the paperwork, or send them in/file them, or does it mean both—the whole process of completing them and sending in?
