Abstract: The National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) provides flood insurance to communities that apply for participation and make a commitment to adopt and enforce land use control measures that are designed to protect development from future flood damages. The application form will enable FEMA to continue to rapidly process new community applications and to thereby more quickly provide flood

insurance protection to the residents of the communities. Participation

in the NFIP is mandatory in order for flood related presidentiallydeclared communities to receive Federal disaster assistance.
