

The Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS) recently commissioned a study of neighborhood dynamics and their relationship to the effectiveness of community policing initiatives. You don't have to answer any questions you don't want to answer, and you can end the survey at any time. The survey takes about 15 minutes to complete.
