# Attachment 2- Instrument to be cognitively tested/ZUMA PIAAC 

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Note to reviewers: Note that selected questions are being tested, thus question numbers do not necessarily follow in order. In addition, individuals calling in for the study will be screened on their work status, whether or not they work at one job or business or more, what kind of work they do, who they work for, how long they have worked at that job, and whether or not they are student (full-time/part-time), etc. The interviewer will have this information prior to the start of the interview.
