I work for The American Institutes for Research, a not-for-profit research organization based in Washington, DC and Palo Alto, California. As you may know, your district has been assisting us and our partners at Berkeley Policy Associates with an evaluation of conversion magnet schools that receive support from the federal government's Magnet Schools Assistance Program (MSAP).
