Justification for Changes to Form I-360

<u>Instruction</u>: The Form I-360 instructions are being amended to comply with section 1244 of Public Law 110-181, dated January 28, 2008. Section 1244 allows Iraq nationals who were employed by or on behalf of the U.S. Government to apply for special immigrant status. This minor addition to the instructions details the statutes requirements such as Iraq nationals must submit an approved risk assessment document.

<u>Form:</u> There are two minor amendments to the form in "Part 2. Classification Requested." USCIS added a check box for Iraq Nationals Who Were Employed by or on Behalf of the U.S. Government. USCIS is also adding a checkbox for Afghanistan or Iraq Nationals who worked with the U.S. Armed Forces as a translator. The translators were previously using the "Other" option on the checkbox list.

USCIS is also adding a space on the form for an e-mail address. The National Service Center requested that we ask for e-mail addresses because it cuts down on the time needed to request missing documents from the alien or representative, oftentimes who are abroad, as opposed to mailing out an Request for Evidence (RFE). This would provide expedient method of communication in the event USCIS may need to contact them.

USCIS estimates it will take an additional hour for Iraq Nationals to obtain the additional evidence. Also, according to the statute, the number of Iraq Nationals who can apply for this benefit is limited to 5,000.
