## Background

The National Medal of Science was established by the 86th Congress in 1959 a Presidential Award to be given to individuals "deserving of special recognition t of their outstanding contributions to knowledge in the physical, biological, mat or engineering sciences." In 1980 Congress expanded this recognition to incluc social and behavioral sciences.

A Committee of 12 scientists and engineers is appointed by the President to exnominees for the Award. Since its establishment, the National Medal of Science awarded to 441 distinguished scientists and engineers whose careers spanned research and development.
