The same law that requires your response to the BRDIS also requires us to keep your report confidential. Only persons sworn to protect Title 13 information may see your data, and they face stiff penalties (up to 5 years in prison and $\$ 250,000$ fine) for any unauthorized disclosure of your confidential information. Copies of your responses that are retained in your files are immune from legal process.

The information developed from the survey serve a number of useful purposes. For example, the survey provides information that can be used to study the effectiveness of tax credits. The data can also assist public officials in allocating research funding by state, which may benefit companies like yours.

This survey is a joint project between the U.S. Census Bureau and the National Science Foundation (NSF). The enclosed letter from the Director of the NSF encourages your response to the survey.
