- 2. Have you studied the variations in food package issuance related to breastfeeding across LWAs? If yes, to what degree do you see local variation in the proportion of postpartum breastfeeding mothers in LWAs who receive the different packages? Is there variation in how much formula infants of partially breastfeeding mothers receive? What do you think are the reasons for this variation?

Implementing the New Regulations

- 4. Are food package changes going to be phased in for different participant groups or done all at once? If phased in, please explain the plan.
- 5. What is your State's timeline for implementing the Interim Rule?
