## SUPPORTING STATEMENT FOR PAPERWORK REDUCTION ACT SUBMISSION 9000-0149, Subcontract Consent

## A. Justification.

1. Administrative requirements. "Consent to subcontract" means the contracting officer's written consent for the prime contractor to enter into a particular subcontract. The objective of "consent to subcontract" as discussed in FAR Part 44, is to evaluate the efficiency and effectiveness with which the contractor spends Government funds, and complies with Government policy when subcontracting.

The information in the consent package provides the administrative contracting officer (ACO)(unless the contracting officer retains the contract for administration or withholds the consent responsibility from delegation to the(ACO) a basis for granting, or withholding consent to subcontract.

3. **Consideration of information technology.** We use improved information technology to the maximum extent practicable. Where both the Government agency and contractors are capable of electronic interchange, the contractors may submit this information collection requirement electronically.

4. **Efforts to identify duplication.** This requirement is being issued under the FAR which has been developed to standardize Federal procurement practices and eliminate unnecessary duplication.

5. If the collection of information impacts small businesses or other entities, describe methods used to minimize burden. The burden applied to small business is the minimum consistent with applicable laws, Executive orders, regulations, and prudent business practices.
