G. <u>INFORMATION SECURITY</u>. By accepting this agreement, the servicing agency agrees to comply with all Federal information technology (IT) laws, regulations and requirements; and shall be responsible for properly protecting all information used, gathered, or developed as a result of work under this agreement.

This includes the right to publish and vend throughout the world in any language and in all media and forms, in whole or in part, for the full term of copyright and all renewals thereof in accordance with this instrument. However, shall not sell or grant copyrights to a 3rd party designee who intends to sell the document as a profit making venture.

No original text or graphics produced and submitted by the Forest Service shall be copyrighted. The Forest Service reserves a royalty-free, nonexclusive, and irrevocable right to reproduce, publish, or otherwise use, and to authorize others to use the work for federal government purposes. This right must be transferred to any sub-agreements or subcontracts.

This provision includes:

- 1. The copyright in any work developed by under this agreement.
- 2. Any right of copyright to which purchase(s) ownership with any federal contributions.

<u>MODIFICATIONS</u>. Modifications within the scope of this instrument must be made by mutual consent of the parties, by the issuance of a written modification signed and dated by all properly authorized, signatory officials, prior to any changes being performed. Requests for modification should be made, in writing, at least days prior to implementation of the requested change. The is not obligated to fund any changes not properly approved in advance.
