#### SUPPORTING STATEMENT User Fees OMB No. 1651-0052

#### A. Justification

1. Explain the circumstances that make the collection of information necessary. Identify any legal or administrative requirements that necessitate the collection. Attach a copy of the appropriate section of each statue and regulation mandating or authorizing the collection of information.

Several statues and regulations, including the Consolidated Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1985 (COBRA – PL 99-272; 19 USC 58c), with the fees established under 19 CFR 24.22 authorizes the collection of user fees by Customs and Border Protection (CBP). The collection of these fees require the collection of information from the party(ies) remitting the fee(s). There are three forms for collection of user fees including the CBP Form 339A for aircraft; CBP Form 339C for decals for commercial vehicles; and CBP Form 339V for decals for vessels.

In addition, CBP requires that all user fee express consignment operators file a report providing CBP with information about airway bills and/or bills of ladings and requirement is for the operators of express consignment courier facilities (ECCFs) to file lists of couriers using the facility in accordance with 19 CFR 128.11. Also, in cases of overpayments, carriers using the courier facilities may send a request to CBP for a refund in accordance with 19 CFR 24.23 (b). This request must specify the grounds for the refund. In addition, a ECCFs are required to file a quarterly report in accordance with 19 CFR 24.23(b)(4):

2. Indicate how, by whom, and for what purpose the information is to be used. Except for a new collection, indicate the actual use the agency has made of the information received from the current collection.

The information that is collected by Customs and Border Protection (CBP) is necessary to allow CBP to track and account for the user fees mandated in the Miscellaneous Trade and Technical Corrections Act of 1999.

#### Public Cost

The estimated cost to the respondents is \$654,136. This is based on the estimated number of burden hours (23,362) multiplied by an estimated hourly rate (\$28.00).

### **13.** Provide an estimate of the total annual cost burden to respondents or record keepers resulting from the collection of information.

There are no record keeping, capital, start-up or maintenance costs associated with this information collection.

#### 14. Provide estimates of annualized cost to the Federal Government. Also provide a description of the method used to estimate cost, which should include quantification of hours, operational expenses (such as equipment overhead, printing, and support staff), and any other expense that would not have been incurred without this collection of information.

The estimated cost to the Federal Government associated with this collection is \$657,212. This is based on the number of responses (75,110) multiplied by the estimated time to process each response (15 minutes or .25 hours) multiplied by the hourly rate (\$35.00).

## 15. Explain the reasons for any program changes or adjustments reported in Items 13 or 14 of the OMB Form 83-I.

The burden hours were increased due to the revision to Form 339C which increased the time per response from 16 minutes to 20 minutes. The burden also increased due to better estimates for the number of Aircraft and Vessels applying for decals.

This information collection will not be published.

## 17. If seeking approval to not display the expiration date, explain the reasons that displaying the expiration date would be inappropriate

CBP will display the expiration date for OMB approval of this information collection.
