- Please report data for the calendar year 2008 (January 1 through December 31).
- For the purpose of this survey, a **youth gang** is defined as "a group of youths or young adults in your jurisdiction that you or other responsible persons in your agency or community are willing to identify or classify as a *gang*." DO NOT include motorcycle gangs, hate or ideology groups, prison gangs, or other exclusively adult gangs. Please base your responses on your records, your personal knowledge, and/or consultations with other agency personnel who are familiar with youth gangs.
- The terms "youth" and "juvenile" are <u>not</u> synonymous. The term "youth" is more general than the term "juvenile," which is a legal designation statutorily defined within each state. Throughout this survey, the term "youth gang" is used to capture information about gangs that is not restricted to juvenile-aged members, but also may include young adults (see "youth gang" definition above).
- Police departments should report only for their cities/towns.
- Sheriffs' departments should report only for their unincorporated service areas. Please exclude any contracted jurisdictions.
