<p>Page 1, Who May File Form I-751?</p>	<p>If you were granted conditional resident status through marriage to a U.S. citizen or permanent resident, use this form to petition for the removal of those conditions.</p> <p>...</p> <p><b>Conditional Resident Children</b></p> <p>In Part 5 of the form, please make sure to include any conditional resident children applying with you in order to have their conditional basis removed, or they may file separately. Please remember to provide their A-number.</p>	<p>If you were granted conditional permanent resident status through marriage to a U.S. citizen or permanent resident, use this form to petition for the removal of those conditions. <b>If you have dependent children who acquired conditional resident status concurrently with you and entered the United States within 90 days of your arrival, then include the names and A-Numbers of these children in Part 5 of this form in order to have their conditional status removed. If you have dependent children who acquired conditional resident status after 90 days from the date of your adjustment or if the conditional resident parent is deceased, then those dependent children must file Form I-751 separately to have their conditional status removed.</b></p>
<p>Page 4, after USCIS Forms and Information</p>	<p><b>[New Section]</b></p>	<p><b>Accommodations for Individuals With Disabilities and Impairments</b></p> <p>USCIS is committed to providing reasonable accommodations for individuals with disabilities and impairments.</p> <p>Accommodations vary with the disability and/or impairment and involve modifications to practices or procedures. For example, if you are:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li><b>1.</b> Unable to use your hands, you may be permitted to take a test orally rather than in writing;</li> <li><b>2.</b> Hearing-impaired, you may be provided with a sign-language interpreter for a USCIS-sponsored training session; or</li> <li><b>3.</b> Unable to travel to a designated USCIS location for an interview, you may be visited at your home or a hospital.</li> </ol> <p>If you believe that you, your spouse, and/or</p>

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		<p>your child(ren) need us to accommodate a disability and/or impairment, check the appropriate "Yes" box(es) and then check any applicable box(es) that describe(s) the nature of the disability(ies) and/or impairment(s). Also, write the type(s) of accommodation(s) you are requesting on the line(s) provided. If you are requesting a sign-language interpreter, indicate which language. If you need more space, use a separate sheet of paper.</p> <p><b>NOTE:</b> All domestic USCIS facilities meet the Accessibility Guidelines of the Americans with Disabilities Act, so you do not need to contact us to request an accommodation for physical access to a domestic USCIS office.</p> <p>USCIS considers requests for accommodations on a case-by-case basis. Asking for an accommodation will not affect your eligibility for the benefit.</p>
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
