DTV Quarterly Activity Station Report

Instructions

This form must be filed by all broadcasters subject to the requirements of 47 C.F.R. §§ 73.3526 and 73.3527. It should be used to provide the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) with information pertaining to all station activity to educate consumers on the transition to digital television (DTV). All stations should log DTV Transition-Related Public Service Announcement (PSAs) and other DTV activities using the appropriate house (identification) numbers. These logs or records should include the date and time that each DTV activity occurred. This form must be filed using the Broadcast Radio and Television Consolidated DataBase System (CDBS), and placed in the station's Public Inspection File and public website, if such exists. On its analog channel, and its primary digital stream, a station must air three transition PSAs, and run three transition crawls, in every quarter of every day. Stations are required to air PSAs or crawls at various times in any given day part, and at least one PSA and one crawl per day must be run during primetime hours. On-air education must not contain inaccurate or misleading statements and must be provided in the same language as a majority of the programming carried by the station. PSAs must be at least 15 seconds, and closed-captioned. Crawls must run during programming for no fewer than 60 consecutive seconds across the bottom or top of the viewing area (See rules for additional details).

Beginning April 1, 2009, Option One stations must also provide information about antenna use, the need for rescanning, and walk-in DTV help centers. These notices must be aired for no fewer than 15 seconds each, at least once per day, between 8 a.m. and 11:35 p.m., and at least three times per week between 8 p.m. and 11 p.m. in the Atlantic, Eastern and Pacific time zones, and between 7 p.m. and 10 p.m. in the Mountain, Central, and Alaskan time zones, until the station terminates analog programming, completes construction of its post-transition digital facility, and begins operation of that facility.
