SUPPORTING STATEMENT FOR PAPERWORK REDUCTION ACT SUBMISSION 9000-0108, BANKRUPTCY

A. Justification.

- 1. Administrative requirements. Under statute, contractors may enter into bankruptcy which may have a significant impact on the contractor's ability to perform its Government contract. The Government often does not receive adequate and timely notice of this event.
- 2. **Uses of information**. The subject contract clause requires contractors to notify the contracting officer within five days after the contractor enters into bankruptcy.
- 3. **Consideration of information technology**. We use improved information technology to the maximum extent practicable. Where both the Government agency and contractors are capable of electronic interchange, the contractors may submit this information collection requirement electronically.
- 4. **Efforts to identify duplication**. This requirement is being issued under the Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR) which has been developed to standardize Federal procurement practices and eliminate unnecessary duplication.
- 5. If the collection of information impacts small businesses or other entities, describe methods used to minimize burden. The burden applied to small businesses is the minimum consistent with applicable laws, Executive orders, regulations, and prudent business practices.
- 6. Describe consequence to Federal program or policy activities if the collection is not conducted or is conducted less frequently. Collection of information on a basis other than solicitation-by-solicitation is not practical.
- 7. **Special circumstances for collection**. Collection is consistent with guidelines in 5 CFR 1320.6.
- 8. **Efforts to consult with persons outside the agency**. Under the procedures established for development of the FAR, agency and public comments were solicited and each comment addressed before finalization of the text. A notice published in the *Federal Register* at 74 FR 27799, June 11, 2009, made this requirement

available to the public and requested comments. No problems regarding this requirement were reported.
