State Election Officials Survey

Note: The paper version of the survey will be printed front to back so that the information regarding a given product will appear on the left side of the open booklet, and the questions about that product will be on the right.

The Survey of State Election Officials is designed to obtain your input on the work products created by the United States Election Assistance Commission (EAC). The Commission was created as part of the Help America Vote Act (HAVA) to assist State and local election officials with the administration of Federal elections. Section 202 of HAVA requires the EAC to serve as a national clearinghouse and resource for the compilation of information and review of procedures with respect to the administration of Federal elections. Since 2004, the EAC has issued guidance on various topics to assist State and local election officials in managing and administering elections. The purpose of this survey is to determine to what extent State Election Officials are aware of the products developed by the EAC, and the degree to which the recommendations and guidance contained in them have been put into practice.

Your input in this process is very important, even if you are not familiar with the products developed by the EAC. This survey should only take 30 minutes to complete. Please respond to all applicable questions. In addition, we ask that you provide any written feedback you may have regarding EAC products.






