


Figure 1: Task 1 asks participants to become a partner with the Boston Regional Office.




Figure 3: The second part of Task 2 asks participants to find information regarding how to identify a Census Field Representative. Information regarding the identification of a Census Field Representative is located inside Contact Us. Users can also get to this page from the homepage of the Los Angeles Regional Office Web page.




Figure 4: Task 3 asks the participant to find the workload hours and qualifications for the Field Representative position in Puerto Rico.




Figure 5: Task 4 asks participants to find the phone number for the Partnership and Data Services Contacts. Task 9 asks participants to find the number of people living in Rockville in the year 2000. Participants may also go through the "Resources & Services" links. Task 9 will evaluate where participants look for statistical data about their community. (http://webdev.ssd.census.gov/regions/charlotte/www/partner_information/)




Figure 6: Task 5 asks participants to request a workshop or presentation from the Philadelphia Regional Office (http://webdev.ssd.census.gov/regions/philadelphia/www/partner_information/




Figure 7: Task 6 asks participants to find directions to the Charlotte Regional Office.




Figure 9: Task 8 asks participants to update their partnership information with the Boston Regional Office that they had previously submitted in Task 1. (http://webdev.ssd.census.gov/regions/boston/www/partner_information/update_partner_information.php)




Figure 10: Task 10 asks participants to find the Los Angeles' Regional Office director's name and phone number. (http://webdev.ssd.census.gov/regions/los_angeles/www/contact_us/)




Figure 11: A debriefing question will ask the participants what they would expect to see on a home page of a Regional Office. (http://webdev.ssd.census.gov/regions/atlanta/)
