5. You started filling out the ACS survey online, but it timed out and now you can't get back in. Find out how to complete the survey.
6. You want to answer the ACS using the online application, but you are concerned about the security of your personal information. Find out how the Census Bureau protects your privacy.

7. You just got a postcard in the mail inviting you to complete the American Community Survey online, but you aren't sure if this is legitimate. What would you do?
