Think-out-loud Instructions:

What I'll ask you to do today is to fill the questionnaire out, just as you would if you accessed it online. But, so I can keep track of what you are doing, I'd like you to describe what you are doing and thinking as you go along. For example, I may ask you a question that seems relatively simple such as "How many cars do you have?" Instead of just providing a number, tell me what you were thinking when you answered it. For example, my response would be "Well I have an SUV that I drive every day and I also have an old truck. But the truck does not currently run. I assume that you mean working cars, so...one. I just have one car." This kind of response will help me understand how you understood and interpreted the question so that we can see what each question means to you. I may remind you to think aloud as we go along. After some of the questions, I will ask you some additional questions about your answers to the Census. Some of these questions may sound may sound a little strange. For example, I might ask you what a certain word means to you or how you came up with your answer. Again, the reason for this is to see how people understand each question. Even though some of these questions may sound like I am giving you a test, there are no right or wrong answers. We are interested in how these questions work for you. Do you have any questions before we begin?
