Who must comply?	This is strictly a voluntary submission.	
What is this collection about?	This information is being requested of manufacturers, vendors, and/or owners of oil skimming equipment. The U.S. Coast Guard (USCG) is specifically looking for oil skimming equipment which utilizes proven technology and has previously demonstrated its capability. The information collected will enable the USCG to determine the availability of skimmers that could potentially be used for the Deepwater Horizon Response in the Gulf of Mexico.	
Where do I find the requirements for this information?	The skimmer information requested is on the attached questionnaire.	
When must information be submitted to the Coast Guard?	The USCG needs this information as soon as feasible to determine the availability of skimmers that could potentially be used to assist in clean-up operations in the Gulf.	
How is the information submitted?	Information is submitted via online form. The form can be viewed in the Homeport Website by clicking here . NOTE: It is estimated that the Oil Skimmer Questionnaire can be completed in 10 minutes. However, there is a 25 minute time limit to "submit" the information. A warning message will appear when there is 5 minutes remaining. For a sample printout of the questionnaire (prior to submitting the information) see the instructions at the top of the form.	
What happens when complete information is received?	The USCG will review the information submitted and determine the viability of the skimming equipment offered for potential use. This information is being collected strictly to identify potential resources if additional skimmers are required to augment the current inventory of them being used in the Gulf. If USCG requires additional data, we may seek a follow-on information collection. This request for information does not obligate the USCG to procure the skimmers being identified.

All of the equipment and contact information will be retained at Coast Guard Headquarters COMDT (CG-432). However, the equipment and contact information may be shared with other Coast Guard offices (such as the National Incident Command) if the oil skimming equipment is determined to be viable for use in the Deepwater Horizon Response. We will contact the submitter and obtain consent prior to release to any person or entity outside of the Federal Government.
