We hope that the information you give us in this interview will allow us to develop better health programs for Black men like yourself. There are 23 questions and it will take about one and a half hours to complete the interview.

I want to remind you that everything you say will be private. This means we won't use your name during this interview, your name won't be on any notes we take or survey forms you fill out. We want to know the real deal, because that would be most helpful to us. So, please use any kind of words or phrases that you want and don't worry that you might offend me. There are no right or wrong answers. We are just interested in knowing what you really think. Do you have any questions?

EXPERIENCES BEING A BLACK MAN

I'd like to begin with a few questions about your experience being a Black man.

1. What is your definition of a Black man?

Probes: What do you like most about being a Black man?
What do you dislike about being a Black man?
What do Black women think about Black men?

EXPERIENCES IN JAIL/PRISON

So now we're going to talk about what it was like to be in jail/prison and what it's been like since you were released.

SEXUAL EXPERIENCES

jail/prison are at higher risk for getting HIV than those who haven't been incarcerated. Many young Black men have never been tested for HIV and so I want to ask you some questions about this.
