However, the equipment and contact information may be shared with other Coast guard offices (such as the National Incident Command) if the oil skimming equipment is determined to be viable for use in the Deepwater Horizon Response. We will contact the submitter and obtain consent prior to release to any person or entity outside of the Federal Government.

“The equipment and contact information may be shared with the National Incident Command, a multi-agency and private sector response team, if the oil skimming equipment is determined to be viable for use in the Deepwater Horizon Response. Additionally, DHS may share contact information pursuant to the routine uses published in DHS/ALL-002 DHS Mailing and Other Lists System of Records (73 FR 71569, November 25, 2008).”
