OSHA proposes to conduct in-depth telephone interviews with one or more knowledgeable safety and
health officials in each of the 25 states that have approved safety and health programs for public sector
employees. Of these states, 20 have programs that cover both private and public sector activities, while
four states have approved programs that cover public sector employees only. Case study interviews will be
based on the private sector questionnaire, but will be less structured and more open-ended, given the ill-
defined nature of responsibility for safety and health practices among governmental agencies and
departments. OSHA will not consider safety and health practices among fire prevention and law
enforcement personnel, given the extensive job-specific training given to these employees.
