

BASELINE SAFETY AND HEALTH PRACTICES

Telephone Interview

Agricultural Establishments

OSHA proposes to conduct a case study review of relevant safety and health practices among establishments in the agriculture universe. OSHA plans to conduct 60 telephone interviews with farms selected at random from the D&B establishment listings. These interviews will use a telephone version of the same questionnaire to be used in the non-agriculture statistical survey.

At the beginning of the telephone interview, OSHA will inform the respondent of the following information.
