1. List of Participants in the project's stakeholder meetings in November 2007 and November 2008.

At these meetings we received feedback from participants regarding the content, format and distribution of the intervention materials that we were developing. The feedback provided was used to make changes. No major suggestion could not be resolved.

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2. List of participants in a meeting at the University of California, San Francisco in February 2007 of researchers interested in the California home care program at which this project was presented for input.

At this meeting we presented our project to a variety of researcher examining programs for home care workers and their clients. We gathered input related to the design of our intervention and also heard about the design of other researchers surveys of these populations. We did not encounter any major obstacles or concerns

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3. Health Communication Expert Meeting-November 29, 2007

At this meeting we gathered feedback on the development of our intervention with a focus on the design of the materials and the development of a social marketing campaign. We got valuable input and did not encounter any major obstacles

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Underground advertising focuses on developing social marketing campaigns for small nonprofit organizations including a campaign to improve health and safety for domestic workers.

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Health Research for Action Center develops health communication materials for diverse populations aimed at reducing health disparities and building healthier communities.

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AED has developed educational campaigns aimed both at improving safety and health of workers and protecting the safety of elders living at home.

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Leslie has developed training programs in occupational safety and health focused on low wage workers including home care workers.

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WID is an internationally recognized public policy institute organized by and for people with disabilities. WID trains doctors and medical staff in culturally competent health care and in how to make services and equipment accessible.

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Mujeres Unidas y Activas (MUA) is a grassroots organization of Latina immigrant women. Through Caring Hands, MUA members receive job training and placement as well as act collectively to help Latina immigrants achieve dignified and just employment.

4. Stakeholder Meeting to Discuss Issues Related to Pandemic Influenza Preparedness for Home Care Workers-CDC Working Group on Pandemic Influenza Planning and Vulnerable Populations-June 10, 2008, Washington DC
