

Justification:

USCIS is changing the Form I-130 and its Instructions in part to require petitioners residing overseas, where there is no USCIS office, to file the Form I-130 and appropriate fees with USCIS domestically rather than with the nearest

U.S. Embassy or consulate. USCIS is also changing the format of the Form I-130 to reflect the use of individual blocks for information requested on the form and standardized wording currently used on all new forms.

The deletion of the monetary information is due to the Office of the Chief Financial Officer providing guidance that a check made out to USDHS will be sufficient and applicants will not have to differentiate based on location.

The deletion of the London, KY address is due to the Records Management Branch ending the contract with the London, KY operating contractor. The new instructions will be revised to guide applicants to the Form AR-11 which will have the new address of where to send the form. The new address is not being placed on individual forms in order to prevent revisions to forms of this matter at a future time.
