Sewage and Greywater Discharge Record Book entries must be made whenever a discharge is made.         |
| <b>How is the information submitted?</b>                      | The VSSP information may be provided in writing or electronically via e-mail to the local CG Sector Office (see contact info below). The Discharge Record Book must be maintained onboard the vessel and available for inspection by the CG.                            |
| <b>What happens when complete information is received?</b>    | Once all required information has been provided and accepted, the CG will notify you in writing.  |
