Marketing program board/committee members in their official capacities are prohibited from taking any action specifically designed to influence legislation, including any attempt to influence public opinion concerning legislation. Board/committee members may not communicate with any official of a State or Federal legislative body for the purpose of attempting to influence legislation. Board/committee members are also prohibited from attempting to influence State or Federal government actions or policies or those of foreign governments, except as specifically authorized under the marketing program or expressly approved by the Secretary of Agriculture.
