Page 9, What Is the Filing Fee?	<p>A fee waiver request will be accepted from a VAWA self-petitioner, or applicant for a T visa or U visa, battered spouse or child of a lawful permanent resident or U.S. citizen, an applicant for Temporary Protected Status, or an alien for whom a determination of their likelihood of becoming a public charge under section 212(a)(4) of the Act is not required at the time of their application for admission or adjustment of status.</p>	<p>A fee waiver may be requested from a VAWA self-petitioner, or applicant for a T visa or U visa, battered spouse or child of a lawful permanent resident or U.S. citizen, an applicant for Temporary Protected Status, or an applicant who is exempt from the public charge grounds of inadmissibility under INA section 212(a)(4). The Form I-912, Request for Fee Waiver, can be used.</p>
