Laboratories will receive

- four *M. tuberculosis* and/or
- one NTM strain, if applicable.

Culture shipments will be sent twice per year [usually January and June]. You will receive an email approximately four weeks prior to shipment delivery notifying you of the shipment date. Some institutions require delivery of all incoming biological specimens to a mail room or central receiving area in a different location from their address. If this is the policy in your institution, please arrange for timely delivery of the specimens to your laboratory.
