

Entering Data [top]

You do not need to complete the questionnaire all at once. However, be sure to click the save button before you close the window or navigate to the next page. The system will time-out after 20 minutes of respondent inactivity and you will need to re-enter the Web application. If you plan to leave your application for an extended length of time, be sure to save your work before leaving. If you enter data and attempt to go to another page without clicking the save button, a message will appear informing you that the data values have been changed. You can either click "OK" to "Save and Continue" or click "Cancel" to continue without saving. Do not use commas or periods when entering data. If you have any comments, click "Notes" option on the menu bar. Describe the data problem or issue in the notes box limited to 2000 characters and click "SAVE". Select a page link to return to the form.

Checking Data [top]

The data that you enter will be checked for addition accuracy. If there is an error in the data that you have entered, a message will appear indicating the nature of the problem. You may either correct the data or choose to ignore it. To check for internal consistency, click the "Data Check" option on the menu bar.

Final Submission [top]

After the entire form has been completed, check the box next to "Only click here when form is ready for final submission and then click Save", and click the "Save" button. You will be given the opportunity to print a copy of your data after it is submitted.
