U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) of the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) conducts evaluations of all facets of the E-Verify Program, an Internet-based system used by participating employers to determine the employment eligibility of new hires. USCIS is currently conducting a study to examine the effectiveness of our various communication methods and outreach activities used to make the public aware of the program and to educate them about it.
