TITLE: Innovation to Drive Productivity in Postsecondary Education Symposium Pre-Symposium Survey

(the survey that is the subject of the 10-day review request)

To respond to President Obama's 2020 college completion challenge in ways that utilize innovative change to drive quality, efficiency and affordability, the U.S. Department of education, working with the White House Office of Science and Technology Policy and the Domestic Policy Council, is convening a symposium on "Innovation to Drive Productivity in Postsecondary Education." The focus will be on innovations that have the potential to transform college and university teaching and learning at scale.

To facilitate discussions at the symposium the New America Foundation is administering a survey to participants prior to the event to generate a better understanding of the perceptions of the innovative teaching and learning resources and the levels of adoption of those resources that are present among the participating institutions and other attendees. The purpose of the survey is to determine

- The extent to which participating institutions are adopting innovations on their campuses;
- Attendee attitudes and perceptions toward innovations in postsecondary teaching and learning; and
- Perceived and actual barriers to innovations in teaching and learning, including federal and state policy, as well as opportunities and points of momentum.

The New America Foundation suggested utilizing a survey as a way to begin the symposium with valuable information that can facilitate the movement forward of the day's agenda. The survey is the idea and the property of the New America Foundation and is **voluntary**. The New America Foundation is developing and administering the survey, as well as collecting the data. The Foundation is not receiving any remuneration for the survey from the Department of Education. The New America Foundation is not obligated to include any of the suggested questions submitted by the Department of Education. New America is not doing this on behalf of the Department nor at the request of the Department. They have been involved in supporting the development of this symposium and believe in its potential value for higher education. Their goal is that this convening achieves its greatest success.
