What is NAEP?

- "NAEP" stands for the National Assessment of Educational Progress.
- NAEP is the largest nationally representative assessment of what America's students know and can do.
- Tests are given to assess student achievement in major subject areas across the nation at grades 4, 8, and 12.
- NAEP results are released as "The Nation's Report Card."



What this means for our school

- Our school has been selected to participate because of its location and demographics.

- You will be given a hall pass telling you where to report.




What to expect (continued)

- The assessment also includes questions about how your teachers teach, your educational experiences, and other informational questions.



What to expect (continued)

- There is no need to study or prepare for NAEP.
- You should try your best to answer each question. NAEP just wants to know how much grade 12 students know about the subject area.
- Your results are anonymous, but they will be combined with the scores of other students to produce a report card for the nation.



Civics Sample Question


Assume that you are a member of Students Against Drunk Driving (SADD) and that you believe that laws against drunk driving should be strengthened.

For each way explain why you think your actions could be effective.




Geography Sample Question




Which city probably suffered the most damage in the earthquake?
