A. Justification.

- 1. Administrative requirements. This information collection requirement has been incorporated in the Online Representations and Certifications Administration (ORCA) program under the Integrated Acquisition Environment, an E-Government initiative.
- 4. **Efforts to identify duplication**. This requirement is being issued under the Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR) which has been developed to standardize Federal procurement practices and eliminate unnecessary duplication.
