3. What challenges did your program experience meeting the reporting requirements in the current FOA?
4. What changes in expectations for program activities should be considered that would improve your program's ability to meet essential components of TB prevention and control?
5. What changes in expectations for reporting requirements should be considered that would improve your program's ability to meet national TB program objectives?
6. What additional ideas should be considered for inclusion in the FOA that would address current challenges?
7. How could the FOA better strengthen control and laboratory program interaction and joint effectiveness?
8. How could the FOA improve the timeliness and usefulness of genotyping information in the national surveillance system?
