The Actito Prevent Pollution From Ships (33 USC 1901) authorizes the Department of Homeland Security to issue certificates to Terminals and Ports verifying their adequacy to receive operational garbage from ships Regulations implementing this program are in 33 CER Code of Federal Regulations Part 158. To continue to receive ships at a port or terminal an applicant must hold a Certificate of Adequacy for Garbage if it receives oceangoing tankers, or any other oceangoing ship of 400 gross tons or more, carrying residues and mixtures containing oil; or if it receives oceangoing ships carrying Noxious Liquid substances. To receive a Certificate of Adequacy for Garbage, application is required on FORM C				
Definitions:				
"Terminal": an onshore facility or an offshore structure located in the navigable waters of the United States or subject to the jurisdiction of the United States and used, or intended to be used, as a facility for the transfer or other handling of a harmful substance. The definition of "navigable waters" for the purposes of this section may be found in 33 CFR 2.05-25.
