<p>The Beginning Teacher Longitudinal Survey (BTLS) follows a sample of public school teachers who were in their first year of teaching in 2007-08. These teachers were first interviewed as part of the 2007-08 Schools and Staffing Survey (SASS) and were also part of the 2008-09 Teacher Follow-up Survey (TFS). They have been contacted again in 2010 and 2011, and will be contacted in 2012 as part of the last follow-up. Following this small subset of the SASS sample for at least a decade will provide much needed data on teachers' careers, attrition, and mobility. This submission requests OMB clearance for changes to the wave 5 questionnaire items, resulting from cognitive interviews conducted in 2011; a revision to the incentive offered to potential survey respondents; and a submission of the results of a wave 4 video reminder experiment.</p>
