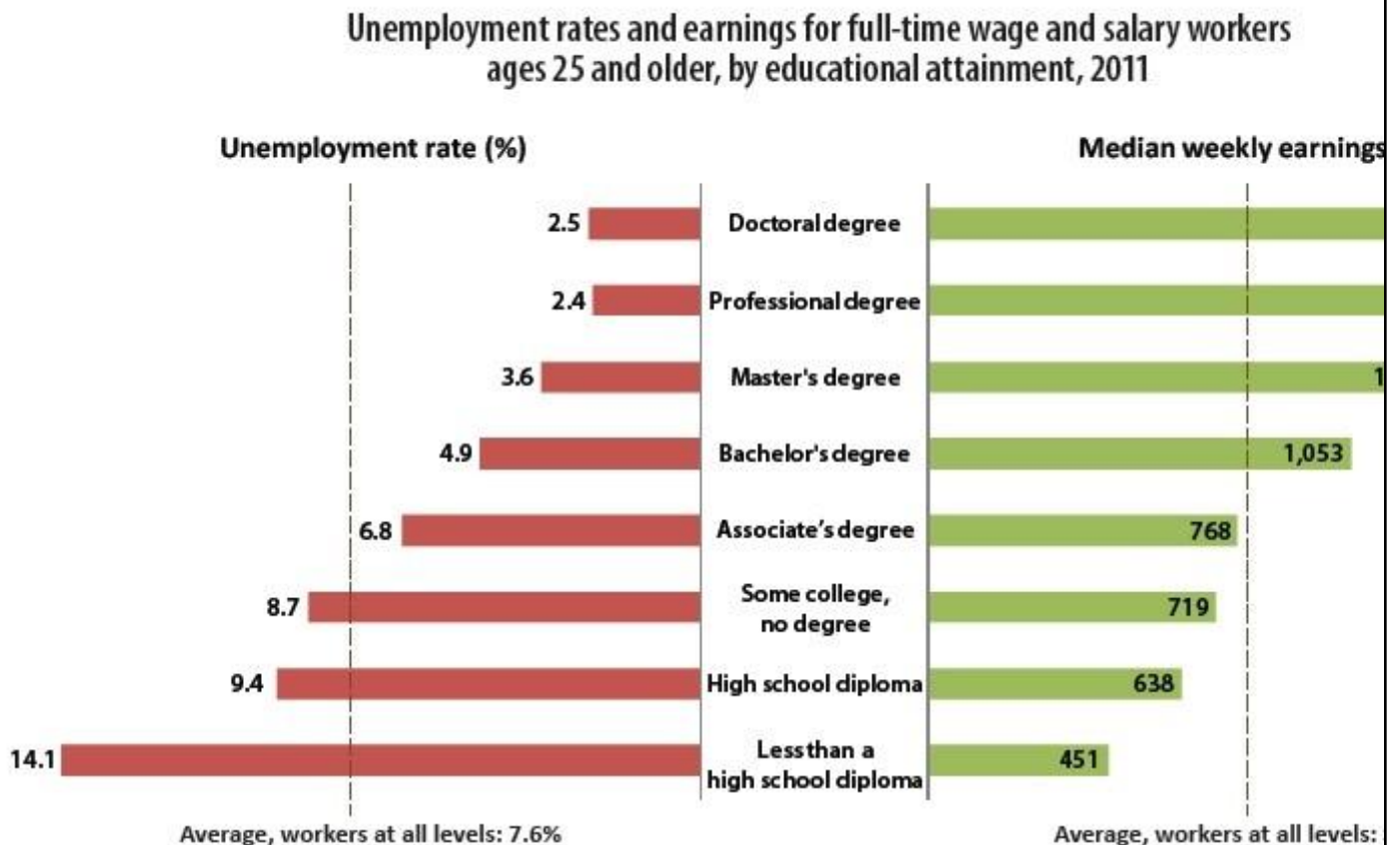

## New school year, old story: Education pays

Wondering if your studies will pay off? Recent data from the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) suggest that they will. As past studies have shown, as workers' level of education increases, their earnings rise and unemployment rates fall.

The chart groups workers' earnings and unemployment by their highest level of educational attainment. Workers with a bachelor's degree, for example, earned about \$415 more a week than workers whose highest level of education is a high school diploma. And the rate of unemployment for workers with a bachelor's degree

was about half that of those with no education beyond high school.
