The national Centers for Disease Control and Prevention is conducting the Study to Explore Early Development (SEED). SEED is one of the largest studies about child development and the causes of autism spectrum disorders. It is taking place in six sites in the United States. To make this study a success, we need children both *with and without an autism spectrum disorder* and their mothers to take part. We hope you will join us.

If you agree to take part in SEED, you will be interviewed over the telephone a couple of times about your child's development and your health during your pregnancy with your child. After these interviews, we will ask you and your child to meet with our study staff in person, either at our study clinic or your home. We will evaluate your child's development and complete several other study activities. A complete list of all study steps can be found in the enclosed brochure.

We know your time is valuable. We offer several incentives to thank you for your participation.

- If you contact us and answer a few questions to see if you and your child qualify for SEED, we will send you a \$10 gift card *even if you decide not to take part in SEED.*
- If you do agree to take part, you will receive additional gift cards for each of the study steps.
- If you complete all parts of the study you will receive \$200 in total.
- You will also receive the results of your child's developmental evaluation.

All parts of the study are voluntary. If you enroll in SEED we ask you to do as much as you can. But, you can choose to do some parts and not others. Please know that any information that you give us about you or your child will be kept private. Only SEED staff will be able to look at any information you give us.
